
Joseph M. Hertzberg N3EA - K3JH -*1907-1994* Joe expired in Silver Spring MD at age 86 - Our subject was previously known as K3JH and was first licensed in 1926 - as 8CYI. During World War II he was involved in the development of electronic navigation systems. His work brought him wide acclaim and he was decorated both the U.S. and over seas in England.

Mr. Hertzberg lived many years in Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania, enjoying ham radio daily. My card from Joseph K3JH from a 7Mhz CW QSO in 1967.



After the war Hertzberg went to work for RCA and in 1956 was named RCA Man of the Year.

Joe ended his career as a corporate vice president of RCA.

In the late 60s he became active in Amateur Radio

once again and his station included a full-size 80 meter cubical quad on a 115 foot Telrex "Big Bertha" rotating pole that was featured in a 1970 QST. He put his station to good use following several natural disasters, including a 1972 earthquake in Nicaragua.

It appears our man used American made equipment as his card states; Receiving Collins 75S3B - Drake R-4 and Hammarlund HQ180A.

Joe was Ham of the Year 1976 Dayton Hamvention, belonging to the following fraternal groups; OOTC, FOC, ARRL A-1

Hertzberg 8CYI - W8JE - K3JH - N3EA expired at age 86. There is another Hertzberg W2DJJ who we will write about later on. No relation to N3EA J.M.Hertzberg
