That conversation about Dave was never confirmed until January 2005 when I received a packet of Dave Garroway memorabilia from Ebay. Pat helped me retrieve that packet and I am very pleased with the information. Later on he may have used a new SX-62.

In going over the packet of information about Dave's personal life, sure enough, there it was the old venerable Hallicrafters SX-42 communications receiver with none other than the Maestro at the tuning controls.

Therefore it is incumbent upon me to induct Mr. Dave Garroway posthumously into our Cambridge Radio Boys, in Honorarium.
