Maurice Bruno (Code is King) Lindenaux *1927-2009* K2BJB - W4NHP -




Moe or Maury usually had exceptional picture postal QSL cards he exchanged with those who collected QSL cards. The personal cards are showing up now on Ebay and other sources on the Interweb.

Sailing regularly on the C2 cargo vessel SS American Press was launched in 1941, built in SanFran. I found two collisions, first in Galveston where the vessel drifted into another and in NY Harbour where she collided with an Israeli Vessel with a loss of life. SS American Press was re-named The Cape Lookout in the mid 50s.

Maury retired to Florida, the Port Richey region - He was a member of the Gulf Coast Amateur Radio Club New Port Richey Florida. At the moment we are trying to contact his daughter Lorelei for permission to extend our tribute.
