Fred had more wonderful talents, established as a foremost painter of the American West, sculptor, writer in collaboration S. Slesinger created

the Red Ryder series. Of the many honors Fred received, he was especially proud to be adopted into the Navajo Nation. Fred's two younger brothers made an earlier success in Hollywood with animated cartoons and produced the popular Merrie Melodies and Looney Tunes series.

Fred's son operates the "Red Ryder Western Art Museum" in Pagosa Springs, Co. Make it on your plans to visit when in the area. It is

To this day as a result of what has become the longest lasting licensing agreement in history, Daisy continues to manufacture the Red Ryder rifle. (Be careful or you'll shoot your eye out Ralphie)
